#### SCHOOL VISION

The faculty and staff of Breaux Bridge Primary will strive to implement best teaching practices that ensure that all students receive optimal learning opportunities. It is our belief that all students CAN learn.

# Schoolwide Strategic Plan Goal (as measured by school SPS score):

School Performance Score will increase from 59.6 to 62.1 by the end of the 2018-19 school year.

# SCHOOLWIDE PLAN GOALS 1 AND 2 (ELA & Math)

To increase our overall ELA index (whole school ELA index) from 57.8 (Preliminary Calculator) to 59.8 by the end of the 2019 school year (on Spring 2019 LEAP test).

To increase our overall Math index (whole school Math index) from 60.8 (Preliminary Calculator) to 62.8 by the end of the 2019 school year (on Spring 2019 LEAP test).

#### HOW WILL WE IMPROVE?

#### Schoolwide Strategies:

TAP Breaux Bridge Primary is a TAP school and follows the model of rigorous teacher improvement. Through TAP teachers and administrators are constantly evaluating the need of the students. Through these needs plans are implemented and job embedded professional development for teachers is provided.

IRLA / ARC - A program designed to reach students at the independent reading level and expose them to complex text.

Students in K-2nd grade are each screened and an independent reading level is established through the IRLA. ARC Core curriculum is used for ELA instruction in K-2nd grades. This balanced literacy approach allows students to have access to information at an independent level.

### RTI - Response to Intervention

Student data and classroom performance are regularly analyzed to identify struggling students. Intervention within the classroom occurs when a need is identified and if this intervention is not successful the student(s) will receive more intense intervention outside of the classroom setting.

iReady Breaux Bridge Primary utilizes iReady for all students and this is also used in the response to intervention model with some students.

#### Students have two iReady times each week - one for Reading and one for Math

By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, BBP will decrease the number of students in iREADY instructional profile 1 for math by 50%. BBP will decrease the number of students in iREADY instructional profile 2 for math by 40%. By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, BBP will decrease the number of students in iREADY instructional profile 1 for reading by 50%. BBP will decrease the number of students in iREADY instructional profile 2 for reading by 40%.

# SCHOOLWIDE PLAN GOAL 3 (for ALL Non-Proficient Subgroups) WITH OBJECTIVES

Subgroup Goal: By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, all subgroups will make adequate progress toward mastery of state standards.

NOTE: Breaux Bridge Primary has no standardized tests - to more effectively reach our students iReady data is analyzed to identify non-proficient populations.

By May 2019, based on the results from spring 2019 MATH iREADY window 3 assessment, students will improve their understanding of addition and subtraction concepts by working with the ideas of joining, separating, or comparing sets using manipulatives or in word problem contexts. (Algebra and Algebraic Thinking)

By May 2019, based on the results from spring 2019 MATH iREADY window 3 assessment, students will improve their understanding of number and concepts of quantity, in areas related to number recognition and counting. Students will improve in relating the part-part-whole concepts to both addition and subtraction. Students will improve in making connections with written numerals and quantities of objects, in rote counting, or in counting with one-to-one correspondence. (Number and Operations)

By May 2019, based on the results from spring 2019 READING iREADY window 3 assessment, students will improve their ability to recognize relationships with common consonant and vowel letter-sounds with opportunities to apply skills to connected text. (Phonics)

By May 2019, based on the results from spring 2019 READING iREADY window 3 assessment, students will increase their vocabulary by identifying relationships among words. Students will increase vocabulary comprehension by drawing meaning from multiple text types.

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SCHOOLWIDE PLAN GOAL 4 DISCIPLINE/NON-ACADEMIC WITH OBJECTIVES

NON-ACADEMIC Goal: BBP has had a very low rate of suspensions over the last few years. We will focus on a 5% reduction in the amount of TOA among all grade levels. This is to increase in-class instructional methods provided to students to have a better impact on vocabulary and algebra skills of all students.

#### HOW WILL WE IMPROVE?

Schoolwide Strategies:

**PBIS expectations** - ensure that all teachers and students are aware and practice the expectations campus wide.

**Second Step instruction -** weekly instructional lessons provided on Tuesdays to each grade level from the Second Step Program.

**Restorative Practice implementation** During periods of TOA restorative practices are utilized by disciplinary team to increase student awareness of appropriate responses.

**School wide system implementation of expectations** All staff is responsible for teaching and maintaining the campus wide expectations at BBP.

**Proactive strategies applied by all faculty** Faculty will consistently focus on being proactive throughout the day to reduce disruptions and maintain on task behavior.

**Use of a continuum of positive supports for both staff and students** BBP will offer incentives to both faculty and staff to encourage involvement in the PBIS process.
